

## Alyssum *Lobularia maritima*

### Snow Crystals

Vigorous white alyssum produces mounds of sweet smelling flowers all summer long. Brighter white than 'Carpet of Snow' in last year's trials.



## Amaranth *Amaranthus caudatus*

### Red Spike

Ideal color and form for late summer and fall arrangements. More useful than other upright types because of its gracefully arched, feathery plumes. Compared to Opopeo, Red Spike's flower heads are darker red, more arched, and airier.



## Basil *Ocimum basilicum*

### Genovese Basil

Intensely scented strain of Sweet Large Leaf basil. Sweet, fragrant leaves are excellent for cooking, drying, and fresh eating. Keep compact by pinching frequently.



## Beet *Beta vulgaris*

### Red Ace

The best all-around red beet. Rapid growth, sweet flavor, and tenderness are the characteristics of Red Ace. The round, smooth, deep red roots size early, with high uniformity. They maintain their sweet tenderness when larger and older. Medium tall, red-veined greens for bunching.



**Broccoli** *Brassica oleracea*

**Arcadia**

Used in our fields for several years now along with 'Green Comet' - very nice sized heads of firm florets - dark green and delicious. Grows well in our neck of the woods.



**Calendula** *Calendula officinalis*

**Pacific Beauty**

This edible annual prefers cooler climates and blooms peak in spring to early summer but can last through the fall. The 2-3" blooms, in shades of orange, cream to yellow garland 1-2 feet tall plants. Nice for cut flower production. Attractive to beneficial insects.



**Cilantro** *Coriandrum sativum*

**Santo**

Standard cilantro. Santo is a slow-bolting selection grown for its leaves. Like the leaves and seeds, the flowers are also edible.



**Cosmos** *Cosmos bipinnatus*

**Sonata Mix**

Beautiful and bright summer flowers in shades of pink, magenta, and white - classic cottage garden flower. Great cut flower.



**Cucumber** *Cucumis sativa*

**Homemade Pickles**

Pickling Cuke! Grow your own to make pickles. The vigorous 5 foot vines exhibit excellent disease resistance, and yield armloads of solid, crisp cucumbers. Pickle-shaped fruit are medium green with small white spines.



**Marketmore**

Popular non-hybrid. The market standard for slicing cucumbers. Grown by most fresh market growers in NH.



**Dill** *Anethum graveolens*

**Fernleaf**

Use the leaves for salads, soups, pickles. Dill flowers attract a multitude of beneficial insects.



**Fennel** *Foeniculum vulgare*

**Bronze & Green**

Micro Mix variety



**Feverfew** *Matricaria parthenium*

**Roya**

Border plant. Scented leaves. Daisy flowers with yellow centers. Can be used as a cut flower. Attracts beneficial insects.



**Gazania** *Gazania rigens*

**New Day Mix**

Free-flowering, compact, 8 to 10 inch plants deliver a carnival of 3 to 4 inch blooms in bright hues of pink, bronze, orange, white and yellow, many striped multicolored and picoteed. Flowers open wide during the day and close as night. Drought-tolerant series performs beautifully in containers and baskets, and as a garden edging or groundcover.



**Kale** *Brassica oleracea*

**Redbor**

A completely magenta kale. Finely curled kale is a striking addition to salads and something new for the ornamental garden as well. Vigorous and cold resistant.



**Lavatera** *Lavatera trimestris*

**Novella**

Compact & well branched, Novella is ideal for mid-summer pot sales for container, garden, or as a pot plant. Delicate pink blossoms.



## Lettuce *Lactuca sativa*

### Rouge dHiver

Another fine French strain from the 1800's. Extremely attractive with delicious, sweet leaves of a more buttery texture than most. Turns red with cool nights. Very frost tolerant, one of the best choices for fall planting.



### Speckled Amish

Open-pollinated. An ornamental bibb of spectacular beauty, its apple-green leaves splashed with maroon flecks. A stunner in your garden or salad. Makes small firm mild-flavored heads



## Lupine *Lupinus russell hybrids*

### Russel's Hybrids Mixed

The Russell hybrids are the most popular lupines. Self-sowing but with progeny whose colors are anyone's guess...makes life interesting.



## Marigold *Tagetes x (triploid)*

### Gem Mix

A mixture of the edible Marigolds - lemon gem, orange gem, and red gem. Each lacy mound is covered with petite half inch single flowers with a citrusy scent. Great for containers or in the garden, also called signet marigolds, they are drought and deer resistant.



Marigold - French *Tagetes patula*

Safari Mix

Early, compact dwarf with double anemone shaped flowers.



Morning Glory *Ipomea tricolor*

Heavenly Blue

Vining, climbing morning glory will bloom profusely once established. Very impressive old fashioned flower.



Nasturtium *Trapoleum majus*

Alaska

Unusual creamy-white and green foliage plus all the popular colors. Bicolored foliage is great for rock gardens or hangers. Edible flowers.



Pea (garden veg.) *Pisum sativum*

Sugar Snap

The original snap pea-an All-America Selections winner. 6 foot vines. Delicious, fleshy 3" round pods are great to eat whole when fully grown.



Spinach *Spinacia*

Space

Medium dark green leave are upright and smooth to slightly savoyed.



Squash - summer *Cucurbita pepo*

Eight Ball

All American Selections winner - Unique round fruited zucchini produced on open, bush plants.



Squash - winter *Cucurbita*

Butternut

This fine Butternut type is the most popular winter squash. Fruit are 8-10 in. long with thick, cylindrical necks. Its flesh color is richer than others, and the fruit store well, late into winter.

**Swiss Chard** *Beta vulgaris*

**Bright Lights**

AAS Winner. Multicolor chard. Stems of many colors including gold, pink, orange, purple, red and white. Lightly savoyed leaves with a mild taste.



**Tomato - Cherry** *Lycopersicon esculentum*

**Sweet Million**

Dark red fruit, disease resistant and a standard cherry for Spring Ledge field production. An improvement over 'Sweet 100' in quantity and quality of fruits.



**Zinnia** *Zinnia angustifolia*

**Profusion Mix**

A mix of all the colors in the very versatile Zinnia Profusion series. Great in full sun - can take dry conditions.



**State Fair**

This one is a sure winner. State Fair Mix has jumbo 5" flowers, a wide range of colors and tall, robust plants. Colors include red, yellow, orange, purple, pink, white and bicolors. Disease resistant with terrific sun and heat tolerance.
